Charles A. (Tony) McGeorge became the tenth President of Valley Forge Military Academy & College in July 2005. An accomplished executive manager and published poet, he has distinguished himself in the business, non-profit and academic sectors. He is the institution's first civilian President.

He served previously as a member of the Board of Trustees for the Valley Forge Military Academy Foundation, and later as a counsel to the office of the President, overseeing enrollment management, marketing and public relations.

Tony McGeorge taught at St. Joseph's University in the graduate school of business and was selected to create their Capstone for the Pharmaceutical MBA. He also taught strategic marketing and business case study courses. He served on the Board of Directors and as a Vice President of Lathian Systems, a leading provider of technology-based medical education. He also served as President of the Medical Inter-Insurance Exchange's Healthcare Analytics Inc.

Tony began his business career at Johnson & Johnson. During his tenure there, he helped to found two operating companies: McNeil Consumer Products Company (Tylenol) and Johnson & Johnson Health Management, Inc. He was one of the national spokespersons for Johnson & Johnson during the Tylenol poisoning crisis that made business history and became a Harvard Business School case study.

Tony's academic background includes a B.A. in Sino-Soviet History from Boston University and a M.S. in the Dynamics of Organizations from the University of Pennsylvania. He holds a certificate in Advanced Management from Northwestern University's Kellogg School of Business.

Mr. McGeorge is a poet and former Board Director of the Iris N. Spencer Poetry awards at Westchester University Poetry Center. He is a recipient of the McKesson Foundation's Neil Harlan Award, PECO's "Hometown Hero" and the 2005 Ronald Reagan Gold Medal.

He founded the Mustang Scholars Foundation, Inc., which provides college scholarships to underprivileged boys and girls of promise. He was elected to the Executive Committee of the Association of Military Colleges and Schools of the United States (AMCSUS) and the Board of Directors of the Pennsylvania Association of Independent Schools in 2007.

He lives in Devon, PA with his wife Joy. They have three sons: Ryan, a Marine; Andrew, a Naval Academy graduate; and Brennan, a 2001 graduate of Valley Forge Military College.
